

Pandemic Protection Concept for holiday programs in Zurich, Lucerne and Zug

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1. Introduction

The following protection concept is based on the protection concept of Pro Juventute with all specifications for the implementation of holiday fun offers in the Zurich region. This protection concept is used for the implementation of holiday care days at Schöb Events in Zurich, Lucerne and Zug. It is aimed at the employees/care team and the parents of registered children.

2. Objective of the measures

The aim of the measures is to protect the employees/care team and the participating children from the holiday programmes on the one hand, and the general population from infection by the new corona virus on the other. In addition, it is important to provide the best possible protection for people at particular risk, including employees, children and parents.

3. Legal framework

In principle, the measures and rules decreed by the Federal Council are binding, in accordance with the current status.

4. Distance rules

By age group, according to the rules for schools and for childcare services:

With the participant lists and group lists, Schöb Events maintains the required attendance lists and guarantees that the distance rules are observed wherever possible.

4.1. Children between 5 and 10 years

Based on the assumption that children up to the age of 10 are less frequently and less severely ill, they should be able to move normally within the activities of the holiday programs.

- No need to observe distance rules among each other and body contact is allowed
- Distance rules of 1.5 meters between children and adults (caregivers)

4.2. Children/teenagers between 11 and 13 years

Based on the assumption that in children and adolescents from the age of 10, the probability of illness increases continuously, but still at a low level, and that the ability to implement measures tends to be higher in older children, further measures in the area of distance rules can also be considered.

- No observance of distance rules among themselves, but at least 1.5 meters distance into adults
- Avoid physical contact

4.3. Teenagers helpers from 16 years and adults/parents

For the childcare team, young helpers aged 16 and over and all parents, the distance rules apply.

- Minimum distance of 1.5 metres
- No physical contact
- In order to keep a crowd of adults as small as possible, parents are requested to drop off their children at the meeting points on time in the morning and leave the meeting point afterwards. Parents are requested to inform Schöb Events in writing before the start of the holiday care week about any changes or important information regarding the participation of their child/children.

- At the public meeting points the handover of the children takes place as follows:
 - > Zurich HB: outside in front of the Sora Sushi Restaurant or Restaurant Imagine
 - > Credit Suisse Uetlihof: outside in front of the Patio Restaurant (staff restaurant)
 - > Credit Suisse Tower: outside in front of the Credit Suisse Tower entrance (opposite Argentina Steakhouse)
 - > Station Oerlikon : outside in front of the Brezelkönig in the underpass east
 - > Station Bubikon : outside in front of the station kiosk
 - > Station Zug: outside in front of the Starbucks Coffeeshop at Metalli
 - > Station Luzern: in the restaurant tibits in a reserved area for children
- At the meeting points at companies, the handover of the children takes place by arrangement.
- Parents are requested to keep the necessary distance when talking to each other. Persons who live in the same household are excluded from this.

5. Hygiene rules

The hygiene regulations of the BAG must be observed:

- Stay at home if you have symptoms.
- Wash your hands thoroughly.
- Cough and sneeze in a handkerchief or crook of your arm.

In addition, further protective measures must be observed during the holiday programme.

5.1. Distance and hygiene

- Posters relating to the FOPH's hygiene and distance rules will be hung up in a clearly visible place at meeting points.
- Schöb Events ensures that the corresponding rules on hygiene, cleaning and disinfection for the rooms and objects are worked out and clearly visible at the meeting points, the individual locations and in the restaurants. The rules are communicated regularly during the holiday programme with the care team, those responsible at the locations and with the children and young people.
- Wherever possible, Schöb Events reserves its own train compartments for train transport in order to comply with the distance rules for children and carers. Schöb Events also registers the groups for transports with public bus companies so that the space available in the buses can be adjusted accordingly.

- The children are asked by the care team to wash their hands at the meeting point in the morning, on arrival at the premises, before meals (lunch, snack, snack) and at the meeting point in the evening.
- Appropriate sanitary facilities and suitable material (disinfectants, disposable towels / paper towels, soap dispensers, closed litter bins) will be available at the meeting points and at the individual locations and restaurants
- For courses that take place outdoors, hygiene measures are always made possible. This can be done with hand disinfectant or water canisters and biodegradable liquid soap. In most cases, however, sanitary facilities are available in the immediate vicinity of the programme location.
- A minimum distance of 2 metres should be maintained whenever possible in contacts between the care team and the children and young people. During the activities with the children, however, it is not possible to prevent that distance rules cannot be observed in individual situations. Distance rules are discussed with the children and young people in the morning before the start of the day trip and are observed as closely as possible. Children and young people already know these rules from school.
- The general preventive wearing of hygiene masks is not a sensible measure in the context of holiday care offers. Masks and disposable gloves will, however, be available from Schöb Events in the event that a carer or child shows symptoms of illness or the rules on distance cannot be observed for a longer period of time. **Parents are asked to provide their children with a face mask. Wearing a face mask during transportation by public transport is mandatory for children over 12 years of age, for children under 12 years of age it is voluntary.**

5.2. Childcare team

- All adults involved in the holiday program will be protected, with hygiene rules and kept at a distance.
- Anyone who feels ill should report this to Romana Schöb of Schöb Events, Tel. 079 401 37 27 and must stay at home. This also applies to the main carers. In such cases, Schöb Events will immediately organise an alternative carer.

5.3. Premises by localities

- Schöb Events clarifies with all localities that the size of the premises of indoor providers allows them to keep their distance. The rooms must be marked with distance markings (entrances, sanitary facilities, etc.).
- The premises must be cleaned at least once a day.
- The rooms must be ventilated hourly and sensitive areas disinfected after each use.

5.4. Implementation of the activities

- On almost all day trips, lunch is taken in the restaurants near the localities or near the activities. Schöb Events informs the restaurants in advance about the exact number of children so that two or three meal times can be organised if necessary due to space constraints.
- If the meals take place outdoors, such as a barbecue, Schöb Events organises cutlery and a plate for each child.
- Each child must take a drinking bottle with them, which can be filled with water during the day trip. The drinking bottle should be written with the name of the child.
- Schöb Events also organises snacks for the morning and afternoon.
- The childcare team will inform the children that they may not share any food or drinks with anyone except their siblings.
- All children and the care team wash their hands thoroughly before and after eating.
- The play material, which is kept at certain locations, is cleaned daily. We recommend that parents give their children their own play material (crayons, paper, games of skill, etc.) for the train rides. Children are also allowed to use a smartphone during train rides, but they must be provided with them on arrival at the destination station.

5.5. Disease during implementation

The BAG's rules for dealing with sick persons and their environment apply here:

- For children with symptoms of illness, the parents will be contacted immediately so that they can pick up the child immediately (according to the emergency numbers on the participant lists). Until the parents are on site, the child must be separated from all others present. This child must be looked after with a protective mask, if necessary with disposable gloves or at a distance.
- Persons who have had close contact with a sick person should be quarantined in accordance with the current recommendations of the Federal Office of Public Health and the instructions and orders of the cantonal health authorities.
- In laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 diseases in the care team, Schöb Events reports this to the cantonal health authorities.
- In the case of laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19 diseases in children/adolescents, the parents must report this to the cantonal health authorities and their guidelines regarding contact tracing apply.
